

Cybergram Yojana



Background

- ▶ The Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India has approved the Cybergram Yojana under the Multi-sectoral Development Programme.
- ▶ The project will be implemented in the Minority Concentration Blocks (MCBs) in 26 States/UTs

Beneficiaries

The scheme intends to cover students of Class VI to Class X belonging to Minority Community notified, as per Section 2(c) of the National Commission for Minority Act 1992, and residing in areas covered under Multi-sectoral Development Programme.

Objective of the project:

- ▶ Become digitally literate
- ▶ Actively participate in knowledge based activities
- ▶ Access financial, social and government services
- ▶ Use Internet for communications
- ▶ Reinforcing the learning of trained beneficiaries by providing free Internet access for 30 hours.

Implementation Framework

- ▶ The Cybergram Initiative would be a component under MsDP.
- ▶ The proposed implementation framework would consist of the Village Level Entrepreneur (VLE) at the village level,
- ▶ Service Center Agencies (SCA) and State Department of Minority Affairs at the state level,
- ▶ CSC e-Governance Services India Limited (CSC SPV) and the Ministry of Minority Affairs at the national level.
- ▶ The State Government will give the proposals as per the guidelines of MsDP and Empowered Committee will approve them.

About CSC SPV... 1/2

- ▶ CSC e-Governance Services India Ltd, a Special Purpose Vehicle setup by the Department of Electronics & Information Technology (DEITY), Govt of India
- ▶ Common Services Center (CSC) Scheme is part of the ambitious National e-Governance Plan (NeGP) with the objective of enabling setting up of ICT enabled front end delivery centers across the Country
- ▶ CSCs enabled to act as a front end delivery points to deliver various services like Government, Social and Private Sector services to the citizen
- ▶ State Governments across India are leveraging the Common Services Centers for improved access to public services in rural India
- ▶ Currently CSCs are engaged in delivery of various Government Services like land records, certificates, utility bill payments etc

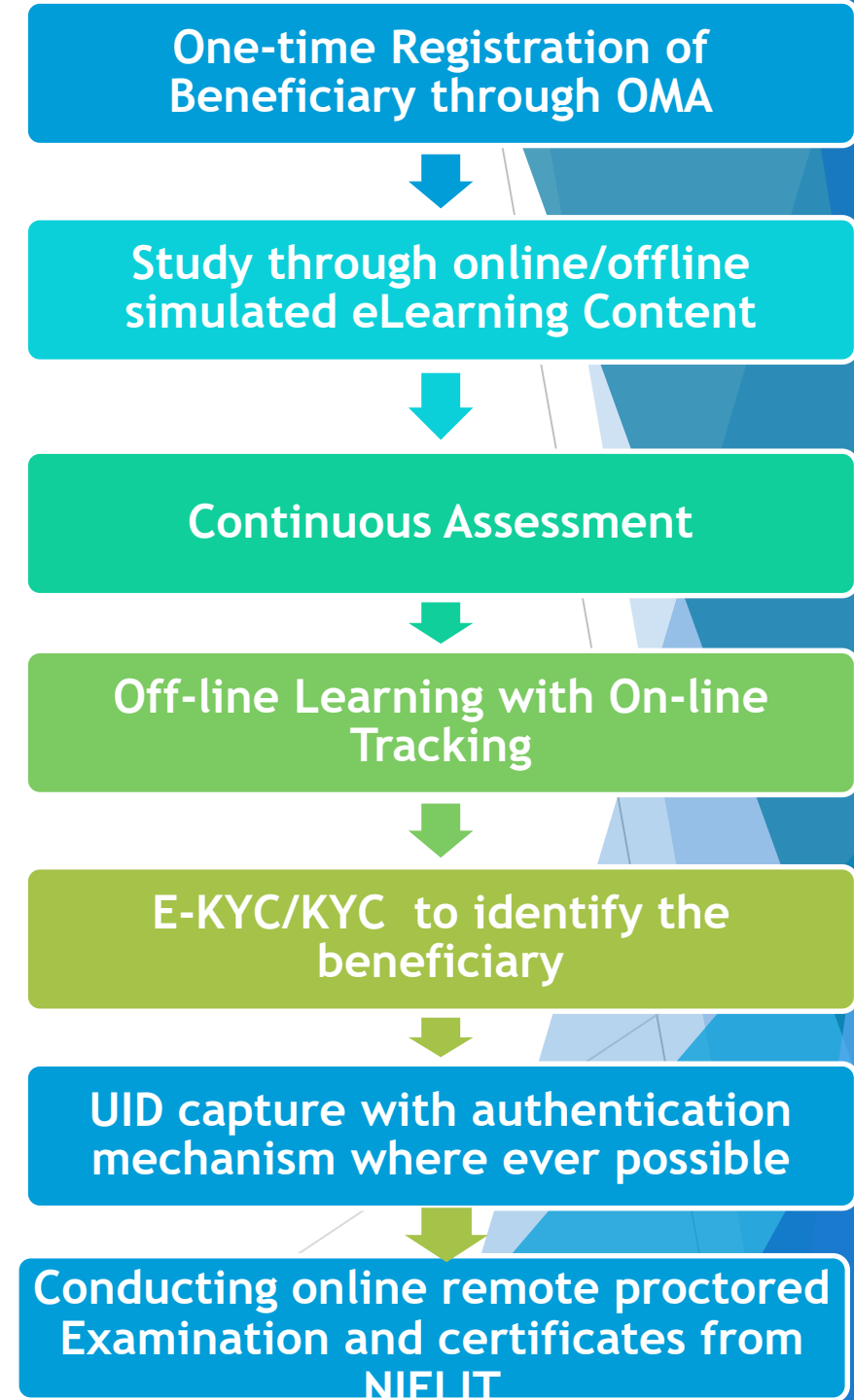
About CSC SPV.... 2/2

To facilitate the successful implementation of the CSC Scheme, a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) named “CSC e-Governance Services India Ltd” has been incorporated by DeitY under the Companies Act 1956.

The SPV is conceptualized to:

- Ensure systemic viability & sustainability of the CSC Scheme
- Provide a standardized framework for collaborative decision making
- Catalyze and maintain content aggregation on an on-going basis
- Monitor achievements of the outcomes by the CSCs
- Enable delivery of G2C and B2C services through CSCs
- Build stakeholder capacity
- Share and replicate best practices

Details of the workflow on OMA

- ▶ The beneficiaries fulfilling the eligibility criteria (as decided by MoMA) will be selected in consultation with the Local Government Representatives.
- ▶ CSCSPV shall develop an Online Monitoring Application (OMA) cum Learning Management System (LMS).
- ▶ The identified Madarasas and Common Service Centres (CSCs) shall be registered on the OMA.
- ▶ The selected beneficiaries shall be registered on the OMA-cum-LMS by the CSCs.
- ▶ The trainers will use the Learning Management System to train the beneficiaries and their learning will be tracked centrally.
